### ABOUT THE PROJECT

The Dialogue In Adult Learning (DIAL) project aims to tackle the issue of social polarization. The vision of the DIAL project can be summarised as 'dialogue for all'. As an overall objective, this translates into making dialogue and related skills accessible to more people than before, with the ultimate goal being a contribution to the campaign against social polarisation.

### ACTIVITIES

The DIAL project implements the following activities:

- design of a research-based model to introduce dialogue and its adaptation in everyday life in 6 languages
- design and testing a training model and pilot training courses for adult educators and others who promote dialogue
- low-threshold dialogue activities among learners to engage them and help them acquire new skills
- mutual learning activities for trainers, other stakeholders, and partners

### EXPECTED OUTCOMES

Through its activities and outputs, the project aims for the following outcomes:

- An increasing number of Europeans have the skills and opportunities to engage in dialogue, and have a greater sense of engagement.
- Trainers, coordinators, and other individuals working in educational institutions have the tools and an increased ability to engage people in dialogue in a variety of settings.
- Dialogue skills are better understood as a basic life skill, especially as comes to adult learners.
